## 5. GUIDANCE PRESENTATION:

Presentation by: Jason Roberts

There are four guidance teachers/councillors that handle approx. 450 students each. This is Jason's 2<sup>nd</sup> year at AHS. Twitter is the main communication tool along with Instagram. It is important for students to check their GAP school email accounts.

Within the first 5 days of school, Guidance helped over 500 students with timetable changes. Guidance has a "pop-up" shop where they set-up in various places in the school on Wednesdays or Thursdays.

There is a mental health nurse that spends Fridays at AHS.

AHS has strengthened their partnership and opportunity with 360kids to help students within this organization.

"Addiction Services" and "Bereaved Families" are helpful organizations that AHS Guidance helps to support students who need these services.

AHS Website has a section on post secondary education. They do spend time with the grade 11 students in the Spring to get them prepared and ready for grade 12.

# MY PATHWAY PLANNER (replacing Career Cruising): INTERACTIVE ONLINE EDUCATION & CAREER/LIFE PLANNING PLATFORMS

**The software** – Canadian based (vs. North American based) – when the student logs in, they land on the home page. There are "4 key inquiry questions" that are asked – you are recommended to revisit these questions twice per year. "Who am I" – lots of survey questions which in turn generate reports. There have been great improvements with this on-line tool in comparison to the previous, Career Cruising software.

"High School Planner" – it generates multiple plans. i.e. "If I take Math and Science, or if I don't take Math in grade 12 - where does that opportunity take me"? You can see based on the course selection and the marks one inputs, the software provides names of universities/colleges and programs that qualify. There is a budgeting planner, bank links, etc. You can flag favourites based on the output match.

**Course selection** – it is a course selection tool as well which will be used in the month of February. This is a way to reduce the immense amount of paper.

#### 6. SERT PRESENTATION

#### Presentation: Scott Green

Student Success Department – Room 334 (they wear many different hats) – every teacher tries to be a student success teacher. The goal is for every student to graduate and have success. SERT students are identified as having a learning disability, or out of the blue have troubles at home or have experienced some recent changes. This department works very closely with teachers, guidance, admin. Room 334 is Mr. Green's office (shared with Donna Ludlow). Mr. Green's background – taught in the elementary French Immersion system in both Math & Science, Geography subjects. Both Mr. Green and Ms. Ludlow have both taken courses in mental health. Part of the portfolio is dealing with transition: elementary to grade 9, also, 10 & 11 to grade 12. His department took over 200 grade 9 students on the Green Acres field trip and also assisted with the Grade 9 day - the first day of school. He also coordinates the "take your kid to work day" in November for grade 9s. This department also supports the Credit Recovery program and ESL. They are a busy team working hard for the betterment of our students.
