4 <u>Cooperative Education Presentation</u>

• Jenna Lynde, Head of Cooperative Education at MMHS, presented an overview of the Cooperative Education Program.

- Experiential method of learning that gives students an opportunity to work outside the school while earning secondary school credits
- Cooperative Education allows students to explore a career of interest, develop job skills, obtain career-related practical experience, gather references for a resume, develop self-confidence that is necessary for success in the workplace, provide up to date technology with learning environment and engaging opportunities.
- Cooperative Education placements are possible for most Grade 11 and 12 courses
- The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) This program is designed for students who wish to pursue a skilled trade while meeting the academic requirements to graduate secondary school. Students may enroll in OYAP in Grade 11 and may continue with OYAP in Grade 12.
- The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) This program is a 2-year certification process that students would begin in Grade 11 and complete by the end of Grade 12.
- The focus for SHSM at MMHS are: Health & Wellness, Business, and Environment. Students will receive certifications and a red seal on their high school diploma.
- Dual Credit Program This programs allow eligible students in high school to take college or apprenticeship courses that count towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma or a postsecondary certificate, diploma, degree or a Certificate of Apprenticeship
- There is Summer School Cooperative Education program that is offered by YRDSB, not by MMHS.
