Full Disclosure

The Ontario Student Transcript provides a record of a student's overall achievement in high school and is required by post-secondary institutions to assess admission to their programs

In grades 9 and 10, only successfully completed courses appear on the transcript

In grades 11 and 12, a list of ALL courses taken or attempted, with percentage grade, will appear on the transcript



Full Time Student Status

Students are required to carry a full-time course load

Grade 9-11 students must carry eight courses

Grade 12 students must carry a **minimum** of six courses (three in each semester)

Night School and E-learning Night School courses are available ONLY if the course cannot be provided during the day (ie. course full, conflicts with timetable, or not offered)



Where am I going?

Explore ALL the possibilities that exist after high school

Awareness of admission requirements for possible destinations

Awareness of labour market trends



How do I get there?

Educational planning - choosing the appropriate courses for your destination

Consultation with parents/guardians





Cooperative Education

2 credit (½ day) or 4 credit (all day)

Must complete an online application form (https://goo.gl/lyQMui) and teacher reference forms

In the spring you will receive an appointment to meet with Co-op to discuss your interests



Dual Credit

Earn both college and high school credits

Regional program - Semester 1 or Semester 2

Select 1 or 2 credit Dual Credit course in Career Cruising

Once a week in the afternoon – can partner with Co-op or take morning classes only

Apprenticeships

Hands-on training program – 85-90% occurs 'on-the-job', while 10-15% takes place in the classroom

Apprentices earn while they learn

Requires competencies in Math, English and Science as well as an aptitude for applied technology and problem solving












Graduation Tracker

View what credits you have earned and still need to complete for your OSSD.






Adding Compulsory Courses

Click on the "+" to open the course options.






Adding Courses

Repeat for each of the compulsory courses.






Adding Courses

Repeat for each of the compulsory courses.






Adding Elective Courses

Click on the "+" to open the course options.






Adding Elective Courses

Course Description


Select the course you want.

If you don't click, on the x in the upper right corner.






Alternate Courses:

Choose these in the same way you choose the Elective courses






Issue Note - Red Sign

PREVENTS YOU FROM SUBMITTING

Warning Note - Blue Sign


Examples:

"You have selected a course that you have previously completed. This course will not count as an additional credit."

- or -

"Before choosing a Co-op Education course, students must meet with the Co-op Department to determine which course code to choose and to receive an Application Form and Teacher Reference."





Other Credits

If you intend to take a course in summer school


Place that course in the "Other Credit" box

This allows you to select an additional course or one that you may not have the prerequisite for.

A blue exclamation mark will appear indicating that the course selected is going to be taken as an extra credit.

Only use this box if very certain you are taking a summer school course.





Final Step


Click the "SUBMIT" button to submit the courses
